



HOUSE ONLY

WHAT IS IT

Items you won't need until you get into your new home

EXAMPLES

Kitchen supplies, bed linens, knick knacks

PACKING TIP

Stack these items tightly since these are items you won't need for a while.

HARD FURNITURE

WHAT IS IT

Sturdy items that can be stacked

EXAMPLES

Tables, chairs, end tables

PACKING TIP

Make sure items won't chafe during the move by separating hard edges with blankets or towels.

SOFT ITEMS

WHAT IS IT

Soft items you will want to check

EXAMPLES

Sofas, mattresses

PACKING TIP

Don't stack heavy items on these as this can cause indents and damage with storage. These items should be covered in a plastic sheet or tarp.

SEASONAL

WHAT IS IT

Items you need to use seasonally

EXAMPLES

Winter jackets, sports equipment, summerware

PACKING TIP

Make sure boxes are clearly labeled. A few extra seconds when packing saves time later.

OCCASIONAL USE

WHAT IS IT

Items you may need from time to time

EXAMPLES

Suitcases, access supplies

PACKING TIP

Pack these items with alike items (bathing suits with suitcases, etc.)

EXCESS

WHAT IS IT

Items you may have forgotten

EXAMPLES

BBQ, shovels, shed items

PACKING TIP

If possible, leave some space in case you need to sort through your items later.
